"Taggin' Along"

It wasn't until my brother got married that the duo finally broke up. Then I realized how special it was to have someone I knew would always be there to play with, always be there to share things with, that was always there taggin' along as we pursued our careers. It was only after I was older that I realized that often my brother had sacrificed what he wanted to do, or what interested him, in order for us to do everything together.

Jesus calls for us to tag along with him because he saved us, he is the source of our life, and he has called us to help him with his work. Jesus is always calling us to tag along with his chores, with his mission to serve and save people. But I have had to learn to adjust. I was always the leader; I always made the choices for my brother and myself. It's not as easy when you're the one that is expected to do the taggin' along.

This Lent our mid-week services focus on following Jesus in our daily life. And Lent is always a great time for us to reflect and examine how we are doing as disciples, that is-followers in training, of our master. When you're taggin' along you may often not know where you are going or what the final goal is. When you're taggin' along you may have to sometimes skip side trips and stops for things you see along the way that you want to do. When Jesus calls us to the life of taggin' along we may have to adjust. We may not know where Jesus is taking us, or even all that he wants us to do except for this: He asks that we simply enjoy his company, taggin' along at his heels, letting him lead the way. And even though I like to be in charge, it's sometimes fun to just let go and follow along for the ride, taggin' along at Jesus' heels.

We will have readings and hymns about Christ's last hours on earth while we extinguish candles and follow his descent into the darkness of the tomb. Traditionally Maundy. Thursday, Good Friday and the service of light of the Easter Vigil of Holy Saturday (which we are doing as part of our Sunrise Service) are considered one single service spread over three days. These three services form our journey with Christ from death to life and are even more moving if you can attend all of them together. Please join us for these special days.

Easter Sunday, we will have Sunrise service at 7:00 a.m. and Festival service at 9:00 a.m., with breakfast in between the services, at both St. John and Trinity. The sunrise services will again start outdoors with a bonfire and service of light as we follow Christ from out of the tomb into the new light of the resurrection. The festival services will celebrate our resurrected life with Christ. Each service is different and you are invited to attend both, the sunrise service completing the three holy days and the festival service as our main Easter celebration.
